# FROM THE PRESIDENT Patty Capistrant, GSN President JUNE 1, 2024-MAY 31, 2025 AUGUST 2024



Dear Members of the Geological Society of Nevada,

In my inaugural address, I would like to express my deep honor and gratitude to the society as we embark on another active year of geologic inquiry and discussion. The Geological Society of Nevada boasts a rich history of promoting the geologic sciences and fostering community.

In 1957 the society's precursor began as a small meeting in the Mackay School of Mines, where the first talk covered the geology of the Virginia City area. From there the group grew and evolved, with membership exceeding 100 members sometime during the mid-1970s, and growing to a whopping 1,200+ members today! The first field trip was in 1981, visiting Alligator Ridge. Members arranged their own transport, meals, and accommodation to/in Ely; and on the day of the trip \$49 got participants a ride to the mine site and lunch. Our first published field trip guide was compiled in 1984 for the trip to Pinson, Florida Canyon, Rochester, and Relief Canyon.

The Geological Society of Nevada became a formal entity on August 25, 1983, with the necessary document filings with the Secretary of State, which included the first constitution and by-laws. These have been updated over the years and can (and should) be viewed by the membership <a href="here">here</a>. Also notable is that the first GSN Symposium took place in 1987 at John Ascuaga's Nugget (now Nugget Casino Resort). The 2027 GSN Symposium, if volunteers (that YOU!) can get it launched, would mark the 40th Anniversary of the event!

A cornerstone of the society has been the monthly newsletter. Since the initial 1957 meeting, a document with information on time, date, location, speaker, and subject has been disseminated to active members. This has grown over the years to include articles, biographies, advertisements, and sponsor information, but the ethos has remained the same: create an opportunity for geological community and camaraderie to occur, and by-god we will show up (malted beverages help)!

I am excited for the year ahead! We have a great line-up of speakers developing in Reno and at our chapters in Elko and Winnemucca, beginning with Doug Silver's talk at the GSN Silver Series, graciously hosted by Dan Kappes (see details on page 3).

Ajeet Milliard is securely holding the reins of the GSN Elko Chapter – she has a solid vision for this year, so watch this space for announcements of speakers and events. And Kris Alvarez is keeping the Winnemucca GSN on strong-footing as president this year, once again.

Our meetings will continue to be hosted at the Atlantis Casino Resort from September through May (including our Christmas Party, organized by the GSN Foundation). The meeting dates will be as follows:



#### **GSN Spring Field Trip 2024 Wrap-Up**

On May 31, 65 geologists convened at a pub in Hawthorne, Nevada for a beverage and catered meal to hear Bryan MacFarlane talk about the history and future of Hecla's Aurora deposit, located in the Bodie Hills, southwest of town. The next day, the entourage drove out to site and got a chance to look at, crawl over, and hammer on not only past-producing veins, but also new vein targets that have never been drilled! This classic epithermal system did not disappoint, with banded vein textures and even one stop boasting open-space vein sediment textures!

In the evening, we assembled at the same pub for an overview by Caleb Stroup of Headwater Gold to hear about the new epithermal vein discovery at Spring Peak, just south of Aurora. The next day, we drove out to site, where Caleb, along with Greg Dering and Andrew Canada, gave an exceptional tour of high level epithermal features, including sinter, geyserite, and palisade textures.

The Field Trip Guidebook (GSN Special Publication 74) offers maps, photos, and geologic write ups on each system. These represent the most up-to-date publications on either system. The publication is for sale on the GSN Online Store here.

# GSN evaluation of alternative meeting venues Conducted by Bob Felder

In response to members' comments about cost, among other things, regarding having our monthly meetings at the Atlantis we conducted a comprehensive evaluation of several other meeting venues. These venues included both new locations and venues that have hosted us in the past. Under consideration in this exercise were location, access, parking, food quality, service capabilities, audio-visual capabilities and cost. What we learned in this exercise is that costs have gone up everywhere, and that there are not a lot of places with a large enough room and quality A/V capabilities to work for our group. The casinos, although not a first choice of many, have the ability to serve a quality meal to a large group, provide a quality service experience and good audio-visual equipment for our speakers and audience. We could have chosen to move and realized a modest cost saving per person, but in our opinion, we would have given up other important qualities that we've come to expect and enjoy at our meetings. ## Nevada Mineral Exploration Coalition (NMEC) 2024 Great Basin Rendezvous

September 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024

For 2024 twelfth Great Basin Rendezvous (GBR), is returning to the Royal Peacock Opal Mine (Mine) near Denio, Nevada. Come join your fellow geologists, drillers, consultants, and their families.

The price will remain the same: members will pay \$20.00 plus \$10.00 for each additional family member over age 12. Non-members will be charged a base fee of \$170.00 which includes NMEC membership for the remainder of 2024 and all of 2025.

A fee of \$10 per person per night will cover dry campsites for tents or small trailers needing no hookups. The charge for larger trailer sites requiring 30-amp hook-ups is \$40.00 per night and 50-amp hook-ups run \$45.00 per night. These fees are over and above the registration fee and will be paid directly to the Mine. You must call the Mine directly at (775) 941-0374 to reserve an RV space.

Breakfast and dinner are included in the price. Friday and Saturday night dinners will again be prepared by our camp host, Julie Wilson, along with her crew. Breakfast will be served on Saturday and Sunday. Julie has hired a band for Saturday night, so bring your steel toe dancing boots.

We have again been given a discount rate for digging at the mine. Digging in the fresh cut-face will cost \$150 or you can sift through the tailings for \$50, both per person per day (some of the greatest finds have come from the tailings). If you get enough digging at your job, think about spending the afternoon at the Virgin Valley Warm Springs (<a href="https://travelnevada.com/camping/virgin-valley-campground-warm-spring/">https://travelnevada.com/camping/virgin-valley-campground-warm-spring/</a>) or just hang out at the beautiful mine campground.

The Royal Peacock Opal Mine has been owned and operated since the 1940s by a single family and offers precious black and white opal digging for a discounted fee to GBR participants. There are 60 dry camping spaces and RV/trailer spots with 30- or 50@amp hook-ups. Quality bathroom and shower facilities are available. We'll gather around the fire ring in the evening near the large grassy area. Famous opals found here include the Northern Lights Delight (also called "the shoe") and the massive Ginkgo Log. At 130 pounds, the Ginkgo Log is among the largest precious opals ever found anywhere in the world! It was found by a customer in the late 1990s.
