# REGIONAL GEOLOGY AND GOLD DEPOSITS OF THE SILVER PEAK AREA

Mineralization Hosted by Metamorphic Core Complexes October 24-26, 2003

The first full day will emphasize the regional geology of this fascinating area; the second day will focus on gold mineralization at Mineral Ridge.
